Dear Sisters, Associates, Co-Workers, Family and Friends,

S. ANGELA BETSCH, OSF

“I have had a WONDERFUL life!” exclaimed Sister Angela Betsch to members of the General Council who came to see her on November 23. The following night as Thanksgiving Day of 2016 was about to come to a close, Angela peacefully journeyed to her home of everlasting thanksgiving.

Dorothy Bernetta Betsch was born in Cincinnati on December 10, 1925 to Frank and Antoinette Betsch. Sibling Mary was one and a half years older and four girls and three boys followed Dorothy. The children attended St. James School where the Oldenburg Franciscans taught and made a lasting impression on Dorothy. Following graduation from Colerain High School, Dorothy worked as a stenographer in an office in the downtown Cincinnati area. Her older sister Mary had already entered the convent at Oldenburg. When Mary’s temporary profession day arrived, the family attended the ceremony. Following that, Mary asked if Dorothy wouldn’t consider coming to Franciscan life also. Dorothy realized it was what she had always wanted and came to Oldenburg on October 4, 1944, eventually taking “Angela” as her religious name.

From 1946-1970, Angela delighted in being a teacher and principal at five different parish schools. But the death of her sister Alberta caused a nagging thought to recur: How could she help the children go on after the death of their mother? So she asked for a period of exclaustation (absence) to live with the family and nurture the children. In a letter to Mother Marie, Angela wrote:


*“The children are fine and working hard in school, doing very well.
John, the three-year old, and I are getting along very well. He speaks of his mother often.
We are praying for a new mom so maybe you will help us in that prayer.”*

On returning to religious life, Angela resumed her teaching career and also served four years as a nurse’s aide in our healthcare facility. But in 1987, another nagging thought began to recur: Was God calling her to serve as a missionary in Papua New Guinea? For the next three and a half years she delighted in the new culture and the eagerness of the children to learn. On her return to the United States she ministered as a tutor for Catholic Charities and then retired to Oldenburg where she drove other Sisters to medical appointments and helped with mailings in the Advancement Office.

We extend our sympathy to S. Angela’s family, friends and loyal students. Many thanks to all who assisted Sr. Angela in these last few months, especially the staff of our St. Clare Hall Healthcare Facility.

Whenever a person would ask Angela about teaching, being a principal, serving as a nurse's aide or ministering in Papua New Guinea, she would always begin her remarks by saying, "It was WONDERFUL!" Our Franciscan Family believes it was WONDERFUL to count Sister Angela Betsch among our members. May her heartfelt joy continue to permeate our lives here on earth.
